ORDINANCE 2017-1736

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING A NEW STREET INTO THE CITY'S PUBLIC STREET SYSTEM, BEING APPROXIMATELY 449 FEET IN LENGTH, HAVING A DEDICATED RIGHT-OF-WAY OF 50 FEET IN WIDTH, KNOWN AS OCTANE DRIVE, FOR MAINTENANCE PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Octane Drive is a newly constructed street, running east to west between US Highway 641 and 4th Street, near the intersection at Utterback Road and is part of the Kennedy Layne Subdivision.

WHEREAS, the improvements consist of curb, gutter and two 14-foot drive lanes, with an overall roadway section of 32 feet.

WHEREAS, the Developer of Kennedy Layne Subdivision has requested the City take Octane Drive over for maintenance purposes.

WHEREAS, the City has received a Letter of Recommendation from BFW Engineering stating that Octane Drive has been inspected and is in conformance to the approved plans as well as all other city requirements.

WHEREAS, the Murray Planning Commission met in regular session on Tuesday, March 21, 2017 and voted 9-0 to recommend the City accept Octane Drive for maintenance purposes

WHEREAS, the following findings are established:

- 1. The street is approximately 449 feet in length, with a dedicated right of way being 50 feet in width.
- 2. A letter was submitted to the Planning and Engineering Department by BFW Engineering stating that the street has been inspected and is in conformance to the approved plans as well as all other city requirements.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MURRAY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council does, by the adoption of this Ordinance, accept the street known as Octane Drive, constructed running east to west between US Highway 641 and 4th Street, near the intersection at Utterback Road and is part of the Kennedy Layne Subdivision, for maintenance purposes. A copy of the Plat depicting the location of Octane Drive, as recorded in Plat Book 53, Page 62, Slide 5178, is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as if fully stated herein and marked Exhibit "A".

Nothing in this Ordinance hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in this Ordinance; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost impaired or affected by this Ordinance.
