

**MURRAY BOARD OF ZONING ADJUSTMENTS

The Murray Board of Zoning Adjustments met in a special called meeting on Wednesday, November 1, 2023 at 4:30 p.m. in City Hall at 500 Main Street.

Chairman Faihst called the meeting to order and welcomed all guests. Lindsay Aycock called the roll.


Public Hearing: Review the mini murals selected for the mural project approved for 507 Main Street, during the September 20, 2023 BZA meeting. The approval to allow the mural to be painted on the back lot retaining wall located at 507 Main Street was made contingent upon the board's approval of the mini murals within the project. Carol Downey gave an overview of the project.

Chairman Faihst opened the public hearing and asked if anyone wished to speak in favor or opposition of this request. No one came forward, so Chairman Faihst closed the public hearing and brought it back to the board for discussion and a motion.

Jim Foster made a motion to approve the mini murals to be painted directly on the back lot (south side) retaining wall, located at 507 Main Street as presented. The testimony presented in this public hearing has shown based on the findings, it does not adversely affect public health, safety, or welfare, will not alter the essential character of the general vicinity, will not cause a hazard or nuisance to the public, and will not allow unreasonable circumvention of the requirements of the zoning ordinance. Chairman Faihst seconded the motion and the motion carried with a 6-0 roll call vote.

Chairman Faihst called for a motion to adjourn.

John Krieb made a motion to adjourn. Jim foster seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at approximately 4:36 p.m.
